IOSH update for POOSH (since last meeting on 27 February – to date)

IOSH-DWP joint-funded pilot: this project continues participants who have received training are now implementing a range of interventions in their respective organisations and feeding back monitoring on a quarterly basis.

IOSH and development fund research fund: in 2009 we continued with our 2008 call for bids on the challenge of securing safe and healthy work for a diverse working population. We've invited 7 applicants to produce full applications for consideration later in the year. We issued a report on an IOSH sponsored study 'Exploring health and safety practitioners' training needs in workplace health issues' carried our at Nottingham University.
