
Standardising the standards...


- 'Annex SL' to develop / revise standards

 - Commons terms and definitions
- Aims to
 - Reduce confusion / inconsistency
 - Enable integration of multiple certifications

- Minimise risk of harm
- Platform for continual improvement
- Integrate H&S
